# USOPC Internally Managed Sport (IMS) - Surfing ATHLETE SELECTION PROCEDURES 2023 PAN AMERICAN GAMES SUP Surf & SUP Race August 24, 2022

### 1. SELECTION SYSTEM

- 1.1. Provide the minimum eligibility requirements for an athlete to be considered for selection to the Team:
  - 1.1.1. Nationality/Passport requirements:

Athlete must be a national of the United States at the time of nomination.

Athlete must hold a valid U.S. passport that will not expire for six months after the conclusion of the Games.

1.1.2. Minimum International Olympic Committee (IOC) and Pan American Sports Organization (Panam Sports) standards for participation:

Any competitor in the Pan American Games must be a national of the country of the National Olympic Committee (NOC) which is entering such competitor. For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the Olympic Charter (Rule 41) and the Panam Sports Constitution (Article 34.4-7).

1.1.3. Minimum International Federation (IF) and/or Continental Federation (CF) standards for participation (if any):

Athlete eligibility requirements and other qualification details are found in the Santiago 2023 Pan American Games Qualification System established by PASA/ISA and approved by Panam Sports:

- 1.1.4. Other requirements (if any):
  - Athlete must sign the USOPC Athlete Agreement and any additional forms that may be required, such as a Waiver & Release, medical consent forms, etc.

- Athlete must successfully complete all Games Registration requirements by stated deadline.
- Any athlete age 18 or older will be required to undergo a background screen in accordance with the current <u>USOPC Background Check</u> Policy.
- Any athlete age 18 or older as of the Closing Ceremony will be required to remain current with the U.S. Center for SafeSport's education and training requirements in accordance with the <u>USOPC</u> Athlete Safety Policy.

- 1.2.2. Describe how athletes qualify for the events listed in 1.2.1.:

Athletes qualify to compete in the 2022 ISA World SUP Championship and the 2023 PASA Games by placing in the top 2, per gender, per discipline, in the following event:

- 2022 USA Surfing Championship, Oceanside, CA June 13-17, 2022
- 1.3. Step-by-step description of the selection process for these Games (include maximum Team size):
  - Maximum Team size for the 2023 Pan Am Games:
    - SUP Surf Men: 1
    - SUP Surf Women: 1
    - SUP Race Men: 1
    - SUP Race Women: 1
  - The 2022 ISA World SUP Championship results take precedence over the 2023
    PASA Games results to determine the qualified athletes, meaning that if a U.S.
    athlete qualifies either gender and discipline at the ISA World SUP Championship,
    the 2023 PASA Games is no longer an automatic qualifier for the United States
    for that gender and discipline.
  - 2022 ISA World SUP Championship

- The USA Team entered in the 2022 ISA World SUP Championship shall be the top two (2) USA eligible finishers per gender, per discipline, from the 2022 USA Surfing Championship.
  - The 2022 ISA World SUP Championship is a non-funded event.
     Athletes shall be required to bear all expenses associated with this event.
- The top four (4) male and top four (4) female finishers, per discipline, at the 2022 ISA World SUP Championship will qualify by name to the Pan Am Games with a maximum of one (1) per gender and discipline per NOC.
- In the event there is a tie in the ranking when determining the highest placed eligible athlete, the athlete with the highest heat-score total from their final heat in the respective event will obtain the quota place.

### • 2023 PASA Games

- The USA Team entered in the 2023 PASA Games shall be the top two (2) USA eligible SUP finishers per gender, per discipline, from the 2022 USA Surfing Championship.
  - The 2023 PASA Games is a non-funded event. Athletes shall be required to bear all expenses associated with this event.
- SUP Surf If the USA has not qualified an athlete in either gender of SUP Surf at the 2022 ISA World SUP Championship, the USA may qualify an athlete at the 2023 PASA Games where the top four (4) men and top four (4) women in SUP Surf will qualify by name, taking note of a maximum of one (1) athlete per gender per NOC.
  - In the event there is a tie in the ranking when determining the highest placed eligible athlete, the athlete with the highest heat-score total from their final heat in the respective event will obtain the quota place.
- SUP Race If the USA has not qualified an athlete in either gender of SUP Race at the 2022 ISA World SUP Championship, the USA may qualify an athlete at the 2023 PASA Games where the top five (5) men and top five (5) women in SUP Race will qualify by name, taking note of a maximum of one (1) athlete per gender per NOC.
  - In the event there is a tie in the ranking when determining the highest placed eligible athlete, the athlete with the highest heat-score total from their final heat in the respective event will obtain the quota place.
  - Qualification for the 2023 Pan Am Games through the 2023 PASA Games is contingent upon an athlete placing within the top sixteen (16) ranking at the respective PASA Qualification Event.

2.3.1. Process that will be used to identify and handle any potential conflicts of interest involving a member of the committee:

All members of the selection committee must comply with the USOPC's conflict of interest policy, to include completing and submitting a disclosure form for review by the USOPC's Ethics Committee prior to convening the committee.

Any member of the selection committee who has an actual, possible, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it to the USOPC's Ethics Committee prior to the start of the selection process and/or recuse him/herself from the review process and/or voting. A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business interest of the committee member poses a direct or indirect relationship, connection, or affiliation, past or present, with an athlete in contention for the applicable team selection that could compromise the committee member's ability to participate in the selection process in an unbiased manner. If a conflict exists, the USOPC's Ethics Committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member's level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse him/herself from participating in discussions and/or voting). For example, if it is determined that a committee member must recuse him/herself from voting, the Ethics Committee may still determine that a committee member who has relevant and necessary information with respect to athlete performance, for example a national team coach or high performance director, may, if requested by the selection committee, provide such information to the committee so long as such information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and so long as the committee member with the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision. The committee

member must not otherwise influence other members of the committee in the selection process.

Additionally, any person (including any potentially impacted athlete or coach of a potentially impacted athlete) with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to USOPC's Ethics Committee. Reports may be made anonymously. No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with the USOPC IMS selection committee appointment process.

## 3. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

3.1. Prior to entry by name to the Local Organizing Committee by the USOPC, the USOPC IMS has jurisdiction over potential nominees.

An athlete who is nominated to the Team by USOPC IMS may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by the USOPC IMS:

- 3.1.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to the USOPC IMS Manager.
- 3.1.2. Injury or illness as certified by a physician (or medical staff) approved by the USOPC. If an athlete refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff) approved by the USOPC, his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.
- 3.1.3. Failure to participate in Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in Section 9 of these procedures.
- 3.1.4. Violation of the USOPC's Code of Conduct for USOPC IMS Programs (see Athlete Agreement at www.teamusa/surfing/athlete-resources).
- 3.1.5. Non-compliance with the eligibility requirements listed in Section 1.1 of these selection procedures.

An athlete who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per the USOPC IMS Complaint Procedures (<a href="https://www.teamusa.org/surfing/athlete-resources">www.teamusa.org/surfing/athlete-resources</a>) and the USOPC Bylaws, Section 9.

3.2. Once athlete entries have been submitted to the USOPC, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team, at which time, in addition to any applicable USOPC IMS Code of Conduct, the USOPC's Delegation Conduct Requirements apply, contained in the USOPC Games Delegation Terms. The USOPC Games Delegation Terms are specific to each Games and made available during the Games registration process; the USOPC's Grievance Procedures and Hearing Process are found within the Delegation Terms.

3.3. An athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team for an adjudicated violation of IOC, Panam Sports, WADA, IF, USADA and/or USOPC antidoping protocol, policies and procedures, as well as the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code and the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy, as applicable.

#### 4. REPLACEMENT OF ATHLETES

- 4.1. Describe the selection and approval process for determining replacement athlete(s) should a vacancy occur:
  - 4.1.1. prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

The replacement athlete for entry into the 2022 ISA World SUP Championship and/or the 2023 PASA Games is the next highest ranked athlete from the 2022 USA Surfing Championships, per gender, per discipline.

If an athlete who qualified by name through the qualification system declines their spot or cannot attend, the only way an additional athlete can become eligible would be if the IF/CF issues an invitation to a new athlete in accordance with the 2023 Pan American Games Qualification System.

4.1.2. after submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

If an athlete who qualified by name through the qualification system declines their spot or cannot attend, the only way an additional athlete can become eligible would be if the IF/CF issues an invitation to a new athlete in accordance with the 2023 Pan American Games Qualification System.

## 5. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

USOPC will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents, including scouting or evaluation forms, etc., and data from the selection process for six months past the date of the Closing Ceremony of the Games.

#### 6. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

In addition to the USOPC Code of Conduct, the following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Pan American Games:

USOPC IMS Athlete Agreement (<u>www.teamusa.org/surfing/athlete-resources</u>)
USOPC's Code of Conduct for USOPC IMS Programs (Exhibit A of the Athlete Agreement)

Athlete must sign the USOPC Athlete Agreement and any additional forms that may be required, such as a Waiver & Release, medical consent forms, etc.

No mandatory training is planned at this time. If mandatory training is added, athletes will be notified at least 45 days prior to any training.

### 10. ANTI-DOPING REQUIREMENTS

Athletes must adhere to all IOC, Panam Sports, WADA, IF, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing as required by the IOC, Panam Sports, WADA, IF, USADA and USOPC rules, as applicable.
