

Pro-Am Sanction Policy

Pro-am sanctions contain a mixture of professional and Olympic-style (amateur) bouts at the same event. Please see below for USA Boxing's Pro-am sanctioning policy:

GENERAL

- USA Boxing Pro-am sanctions are only approved by the national office.
- Only USA Boxing member clubs or organizations may apply for a pro-am.
- USA Boxing is only responsible for the amateur portion of the event.
- Pro-am events shall be governed by current USA Boxing rules, policies and procedures.
- Pro-am sanctions require a financial statement within 30 days from the conclusion of the event. Failure to do will suspend the sanctioning privileges of the host for all current and future USA Boxing sanctions.

APPROVAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The hosting LBC must be able to accommodate the event. If the LBC is unable to do so, the sanction will be denied or rescheduled.
- 2. The USA Boxing national office requires the following documentation:
 - o A copy of the general liability insurance policy insuring the professional event.
 - o A copy of the medical/AD&D insurance policy for the professional athletes.

NOTE: USA Boxing members are separately insured by USA Boxing's insurance. For more information, click <u>HERE</u>.

- 3. Documents must be submitted to the national office no less than 10 days from the event. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of the event. Documents can be emailed to Andrew Banuet abanuet@usaboxing.org.
- 4. The host/sanction holder is required to pay the LBC \$100.00 for each USA Boxing sanctioned bout contested at the event. Payment is to be arranged directly with the LBC. LBC contact information can be found HERE.
