SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

These procedures outline the pathway for selection to the 2025 International Ski Mountaineering Federation (ISMF) World Championships for Ski Mountaineering. The total quota per National Olympic Committee (NOC) in the Sprint discipline at the Senior level is four (4) men and four (4) women. The total quota per NOC in the Mixed Relay race is three (3) teams, each consisting of one (1) man and (1) woman.

SECTION 2: ATHLETE REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Nationality/Passports Requirements:
 - Have a valid United States passport at the time of nomination that does not expire for six months after the conclusion of the 2025 ISMF World Championships.
- 2. Minimum International Ski Mountaineering Federation (ISMF) Requirements:
 - o Abide by the rules in ISMF Rules and Guidelines, including nationality/citizenship requirements.
 - For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to section 25.1.1. of the <u>ISMF</u> <u>Rules and Guidelines</u>.
 - Comply with all ISMF eligibility requirements found here: https://www.ismf-ski.org/webpages/official-texts/sport-regulations/.
 - Athletes must be born on or before 31 December 2006 to compete in the Senior Level Sprint event in accordance with Article 23.1 of the ISMF Athlete Participation Category Rules.
 - Athletes must be born on or before 31 December 2008 to compete in the Senior Level Mixed Relay event in accordance with Article 23.1 of the ISMF Athlete Participation Category Rules.
 - Athlete must satisfy the medical requirements in accordance with Article 2.3 of the <u>ISMF Athletes</u>
 Participation Rules and the ISMF Anti-Doping Rules.

3. IMS Requirements:

- Comply with the USOPC IMS Ski Mountaineering Athlete Agreement.
- Comply with the IMS Athlete Code of Conduct for Internally Managed Sport Programs.
- Comply with the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code.
- Undergo a background screen in accordance with the current <u>USOPC Background Check Policy</u> if you will be age 18 or older.
- Athlete must have an active USA Skimo membership.
- Athlete does not have an active suspension from the U.S. Center for SafeSport that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Games.
- Athlete does not have an active sanction for an anti-doping rule/policy violation that would make the

Athlete ineligible to participate in the Games.

 Meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, local laws, USOPC, and ISMF.

4. Anti-Doping Requirements:

Agree to be bound by and adhere to all IOC, WADA, ISMF, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing and an agreement to be bound to the results management authority of the IOC, WADA, ISMF, USADA, or other Anti-Doping Organization as applicable.

SECTION 3: EVALUATIVE EVENTS

Event names, dates and locations of all trials, competitions, and camps to be used as part of the selection process.

The additional quota slots will be determined by the <u>USA Skimo Ranking List</u>, following the procedures outlined in the <u>USA Skimo Ranking System</u>. Nomination will be made in rank order according to this system for both the Sprint and Mixed Relay disciplines. The evaluation period for these rankings will take place from February 4, 2024, to February 4, 2025. If an athlete who qualifies for the 2025 World Championship at the Wasatch Powderkeg event is unavailable to participate in the 2025 World Championship, USOPC IMS – Ski Mountaineering will follow the athlete replacement procedures outlined in Section 9 to fill the vacancy.

SECTION 4: SELECTION PROCESS

4.1 TOTAL QUOTA PLACES:

The total quota per NOC in the Sprint discipline at the Senior Level is four (4) men and four (4) women. The total quota per NOC in the Mixed Relay race at the Senior Level is three (3) teams, each consisting of one (1) man and one (1) woman.

For the purpose of these selection procedures, the Sprint and Mixed Relay components of the Team shall be considered separately.

4.2 EVALUATION EVENT QUALIFICATION PATHWAY:

The Wasatch Powderkeg event is open to all participants without the need for an invitation. Athletes must complete all registration requirements by the stated deadline. Event information can be found here: https://www.wasatchpowderkeg.com/.

4.3 NOMINATION TO THE TEAM:

Athletes will earn a nomination to the 2025 ISMF World Championship Team through the following:

- A. Senior Sprint: Finish in either first or second place in the Senior Level Sprint discipline at the Wasatch Powderkeg event on Thursday, January 9, 2025.
 - Athletes must meet the age requirement outlined in Section 2 to compete in the Senior Level Sprint at the 2025 World Championships.
- B. Senior Mixed Relay: Achieve the fastest combined time, which consists of the individual athlete's qualification time and the A or B heat time, in the Senior Level or Youth Level Mixed Relay discipline at the Wasatch Powderkeg on Wednesday, January 8, 2025.

In the event of a conflict between this overview and the ISMF Qualification System, the ISMF Qualification System will take precedent. For more details, please refer to the ISMF Qualification System directly here: https://www.ismf-ski.org/webpages/official-texts/sport-regulations/.

SECTION 6: MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

USOPC IMS – Ski Mountaineering does not anticipate any mandatory training and/or competition for athletes who are nominated to the 2025 World Championship Team.

SECTION 7: DATE OF TEAM NOMINATION

IMS will nominate the Team, including any replacements/alternates on or before February 14, 2025.

SECTION 8: REMOVAL OF ATHLETES FROM THE TEAM IMS JURISDICTION

- a. An athlete who is nominated to the Team by IMS may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by IMS:
 - i. <u>Voluntary withdrawal</u>. Athlete submits a written letter to the Senior Director, Internally Managed Sports requesting to voluntarily withdraw from the Team.
 - ii. <u>Injury or illness</u>. A physician (or medical staff) approved by USOPC IMS Ski Mountaineering provides certification that the Athlete has a debilitating condition. If Athlete refuses to provide verification of their illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff), their injury will be assumed to be debilitating, and they may be removed from the Team.
 - iii. <u>Failure to participate</u>. Athlete does not participate in all Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in these procedures.
 - iv. <u>Code of Conduct Violation.</u> Athlete violates the <u>Athlete Code of Conduct for Internally Managed Sport Programs</u>
 - v. <u>Athlete Agreement</u>. Athlete violates a term in their signed USOPC IMS Ski Mountaineering Athlete Agreement.
 - vi. <u>Non-compliance</u>. Athlete does not meet the athlete eligibility requirements listed in Section 2 these selection procedures.
- b. An Athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team if found to have violated IOC, WADA, ISMF, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy, as applicable.

SECTION 9: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS PRIOR TO SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

9.1 Should a vacancy occur prior to submission of Entries by Name to the LOC, slots will be filled by the next highest ranked eligible athlete in the respective gender and discipline on the <u>USA Skimo Ranking List</u>. Selection will be made in rank order according to this system for both the Sprint and Mixed Relay disciplines.

SECTION 10: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 10.1 Should a vacancy occur after submission of Entries by Name to the LOC, if allowed, USOPC IMS Ski Mountaineering will follow the procedure in Section 9.
- 10.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Section 2.

SECTION 11: RIGHT TO A HEARING

An athlete who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per the <u>IMS</u> Complaint Procedures.

SECTION 12: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

SECTION 13: DISCLAIMERS

These procedures are based on ISMF rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in ISMF rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USOPC IMS – Ski Mountaineering.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency. If any force of nature, pandemic, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions.

SECTION 14: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All members of the Selection Committee (Section 5.3) and all individuals who developed these selection procedures (Section 19) must comply with the <u>USOPC Conflict of Interest Policy</u>, to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the USOPC Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee.

A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business relationship or interferes with, or maybe perceived to interfere with a committee member's ability to be impartial and participate in

the selection process in a fair and impartial manner. Any member of the Selection Committee who has an actual, possible, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it prior to the start of the selection process and may be required to recuse him/herself from the Selection Committee's discussions and/or voting.

If a conflict exists, the USOPC Ethics & Compliance Committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member's level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse him/herself from participating in discussions and/or voting) by following the USOPC Ethics Procedures.

The AAG representative will not participate in the Ethics & Compliance Committee's deliberations or decision. Once a decision has been made, the Ethics & Compliance Committee will provide a written decision, including directions to mitigate the conflict, to the affected parties and to USOPC IMS staff. The Ethics & Compliance Committee's decision is final and is not subject to further review.

Additionally, any person with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest through the <u>USOPC's Integrity Portal</u>. No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest. In addition, the USOPC maintains a strict no retaliation policy that prohibits any employee, contractor, agent, volunteer, or member of the USOPC to take or threaten to take any action against an athlete for reporting information to or seeking assistance from the Office of the Athlete Ombuds.

APPENDIX B - GLOSSARY

Contingency means a future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty.

Delegation Event means the Olympic Games, the Olympic Winter Games, the Paralympic Games, the Paralympic Winter Games, the Pan American Games, and the Parapan American Games.

Force Majeure means an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled (e.g., hurricane, tornado, etc.).

Grievance Procedures means the process that enables an athlete to file a complaint with the NGB or USOPC.

Jurisdiction means the power or authority to make decisions and judgments.

Nominated means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the Selection Committee to IMS.

Protected Competition means a Delegation Event or a Qualifying Competition.

Qualifying Competition means either of the following:

- i. **NGB Qualifying Competition:** Any competition or activity organized or approved by the NGB where the athlete's performance or results are considered in the published selection criteria to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
- ii. **International Qualifying Competition**: Any international sport competition where (i) athletes represent the United States against athletes representing other nations, (ii) the NGB officially designates entrants, as required by the competition organizers, and (iii) athlete results or performance are included in the published criteria to qualify, or be selected, to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.

Selected means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by IMS to the LOC at the final submission date, as determined by the LOC.
