



USA Triathlon - International Competition Panel

Last Updated January 8, 2026

Most Athletes who compete in World Triathlon competitions earn their spot on a provisional start list objectively and then roll onto the final start list.

In some instances, however, USA Triathlon (USAT) may choose to replace an Athlete on the provisional start list for the following reasons: i) the Athlete is on the list as a placeholder; ii) the Athlete is unable to compete due to injury, illness or extenuating circumstance; or iii) to support USAT strategic performance and development initiatives.. Also, if no ranking list or objective performance automatically selects an Athlete for an event, USAT may select an Athlete for an event via discretion.

In any of the above situations where an Athlete may be adversely affected, the International Competition Panel (ICP) will be asked to review the decision to ensure it meets the discretion principles published in the event criteria for that level of event. The following explains how this process works.

The International Competition Panel (“ICP”) will utilize discretion to select or substitute athletes to participate in international competitions when necessary. The ICP must come to a unanimous decision in order to move forward with the change. USAT will post a list of eligible people to comprise the ICP in this document which will be posted on its website at the beginning of every calendar year.. The USAT High Performance leadership, in consultation with the USA Triathlon Athlete Advisory Council (AAC), will constitute the ICP from the list of eligible people as needed and per the following composition requirements.

The ICP will be comprised of two AAC members or an approved previous AAC member if one cannot be found due to conflict of interest. If no previous AAC member can be found due to conflict of interest, an eligible “Elite 10-year Athlete” will be utilized.

- 2 Elite Triathlon Athlete Representatives
- 1 USAT High Performance leadership representative

- 2 Elite Paratriathlon Athlete Representatives
- 1 USAT High Performance leadership representative

Definitions

Athlete Representatives: Athlete Representatives must meet the “Elite 10 Year Athlete” definition (in USAT’s Bylaws) and will be selected and confirmed by the AAC.

Meeting Minutes: Each ICP creates meeting minutes to document that it has followed the procedures in making these discretionary decisions. Meeting notes of ICPs are generally not public and shall not be published to protect the privacy of all athletes, unless required to be disclosed by a specific legal process. USAT’s high performance team will keep copies of the relevant minutes.
