# TOURNAMENT BID INFORMATION

## TOURNAMENT BID INFORMATION

USA Artistic Swimming is pleased to take this opportunity to introduce you to the Olympic sport of artistic swimming and its national events. USA Artistic Swimming hosts a series of national and international artistic swimming throughout the year.

USA Artistic Swimming will accept bids from any city, CVB, sports commission or artistic swimming division interested in hosting a national event. The bid must provide facilities, commit services, supply personnel, volunteers and proposed host hotels to USA Artistic Swimming. The range of events and the flexibility that USA Artistic Swimming offers in sharing responsibilities provides hosts with various levels of involvement.

## PROPOSALS DEADLINE

2027 proposals are due by May 1, 2026.

2028 proposals are due by September 1, 2026.

2029 proposals are due by September 1, 2027.

2030 proposals are due by September 1, 2028

USA Artistic Swimming will rotate each event location annually. We are interested in multiyear agreements with hosts that will rotate through multiple events. Example would be to host 2027 Junior Olympic, 2028 Masters, and 2029 Youth & 12U.

Proposals are accepted and evaluated on a rolling basis, so events may be awarded to cities that have submitted excellent bids in advance of the deadline.

## EVENT HOUSING

Housing Service (HS): USA Artistic Swimming has a partnership with TEAMS Solutions. The event host will be required to work with our housing partner to find hotels in close proximity to the venue and assist in covering fifteen (15) complimentary rooms for head staff and officials, a minimum rebate of \$15, and a 10% commission. The headquarters hotel shall be near the venue. All hotels should be within 20 minutes of the venue. Preference will be given to hotels that offer no attrition.

Bids will not be awarded until sufficient hotel needs are deemed available.

**REQUIRED:** Complimentary breakfast for any official or staff staying at a headquarters hotel from the day after check-in through the day of departure.

# BID INCENTIVES

A LOC that is comprised of both representatives of a local artistic swimming club (when possible) and CVB/Sports Commission members provides the most attractive combination for a successful event. The following are additional incentives when selecting our host location:



The city is located within one hour to a hub airport.



Bids that cover the cost of the facility rental are viewed favorably.



Covering the cost of catering meals for staff and judges. Additional incentive when including coaches in this catering.



Having the host hotel(s) within walking distance of the venue for convenience and to alleviate USA Artistic Swimming of having to use cabs/rental cars/shuttles.



Provide a keepsake/gift for all registrants (150 - 1,500 total depending on the event) – typically something with the city logo.



Securing of city/local grants to aid local grassroots/developmental artistic swimming programs.

# BID REQUIREMENTS

Please include the following information in your proposal.

## REQUIREMENTS FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

- All inclusive facility rental fee.
- Venue layout and detailed map outlining:
  - Pool depths, deck space, dry land training area, meeting rooms, locker rooms,
- Details for internet, electrical, scoreboard, expo space, spectator seating & parking.
- Hotel grid for staff and attendee rooms including rate, breakfast and distance from venue.
- CVB/Sport commission proposed incentives.
- Volunteer resources. Local artistic swimming clubs preferred but not required.
- Free parking at venue for staff and judges.
- Pipe and drape rental estimate.
- Onsite catering options or off-site preferred vendors along with menus & prices.

## REQUESTS FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

- Platform staging for judges. Needs to fit 4-6 tables with chairs on both sides of pool.
- Local sponsors for meals.

# HOST REQUIREMENTS

In the event that the championship is located where a USAAS club resides, USAAS will work with the local club to provide event support in these two areas. In return, USAAS will provide a sponsorship to the local club for their support. These amounts will be determined between USAAS & the local club. In the event that the championship is NOT located where a USAAS club resides, we require support in sourcing volunteers from the host but request support for hospitality.

## VOLUNTEER NEEDS FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Volunteers for a national championship do not need artistic swimming sport knowledge. We need 15 volunteers onsite in the positions outlined below. During figure events at Junior Olympics, Youth & 12U Championship & Masters Championship, we require an additional 20 volunteers for 2-4 hours on one day only.

## VOLUNTEER SAMPLE SCHEDULE

Four hour shifts minimum but a volunteer can stay all day.

Morning Shift: 7:00 AM - 11:00 AM

Afternoon Shift: 11:00 AM - 3:00 PM

Evening Shift: 3:00 PM - 7:00 PM

## VOLUNTEER POSITIONS

Hospitality	1	Help set up hospitality meals and keep snacks and drinks full for staff & judges.
Deck Marshal	1-3	Stationed around the pool deck to prevent walking during routine swims.
Door Guards	TBD	Only needed if multiple entrances to pool deck.
Tickets	2	Selling & scanning spectator tickets and issuing wristbands.
Team Check In	2	Handing out team credentials.
Live Stream	2	Recording routine swims using a video camera on the pool deck.
Announcer	2	Prefer sport experience and announcer experience for this volunteer position.
Video Recorder	2	Using an iPad or similar device to record routine swim for judge reviews.
Figures	20	Recording scores on paper as judges announce them.
Event Set up	5	Assisting USAAS staff setting up signage and event equipment.
Event Tear Down	5	Assisting USAAS staff in taking down signage and event equipment to pack.

## HOSPITALITY FOR EVENT STAFF & JUDGES

Hospitality is required to be provided for event staff and judges. Hospitality includes snacks & beverages throughout the event as well as lunch daily. In the event that the schedule runs past 5:00 PM, dinner will also be required. Hospitality for coaches is requested but not required and depends on space at the venue. Below are the estimated numbers for each event per day.

- National & Junior Championship

  - 75 coaches
- Youth Championship & 12U Invite
  - 75 coaches
- Junior Olympic Championship
  - 75 coaches
- Masters Championship
  - 20 coaches

# VENUE REQUIREMENTS

The venue must be available from approximately 6:00 AM to 8:00 PM each day of the event and at least one day in advance for set up. Set up day does not require any water space reserved.

## Water Temperature

- 80 – 82°F for all events

## Pool Needs:

- 50M pool with 8-10 lanes. We will split the pool into two sides using a lane line, bulk head or USAAS banner.
- Deep side or Competition area:
  - 12 meters (40') by 25 meters (82') is required.
  - Minimum depth of 3 meters (10') with a gradual slop to no more than 2 meters (6.5').
  - The majority of this side of the pool should be 8' or deeper.
- Shallow side:
  - No minimum depth required but preferred 7' deep throughout.

## Athlete Walk Out & Ready Area

- The athlete walk out area needs to be clear of any obstacles (boards or start blocks) and covered with a non-slip surface.
- Ready area is a 10' x 10' space near the walk out for teams to wait for their swim.

## Deck Space, Judge & Athlete Seating

- 8' - 12' from edge of water to walls.
- Bleachers set up around shallow side of pool for athletes.
- Elevated riser (if available) and tables/chairs around deep side of pool for judges.

## Dry Land Practice & Team Area

- Sufficient open space (classrooms, gym, outdoor area, etc.) out of spectator view and inclement weather conditions. Space large enough to fit all athletes at the event.

## Meeting Rooms & Meet Official Room

- Judge & Staff Hospitality room large enough for 40 people
- Scoring room: Large enough for 3 people and on the pool deck.
- Coach Hospitality room large enough for 75 coaches. Not required but preferred.

## Locker Room & Restrooms

- Athletes: enough lockers, showers, restrooms and mirrors with available hot and cold water, non-slip walkways. Male, female, and non-binary athlete locker rooms.
- Spectators: separate from athlete locker rooms and staff restrooms.
- Coach, Staff & Judges: separate from athlete locker rooms & spectator restrooms.

# VENUE REQUIREMENTS

## Internet

- Hardline internet connection for live streaming.
- Dedicated Wi-Fi for up to five event staff.

## Electrical Capacity

- multiple GFCI outlets for use around the pool deck for sound, scoring and video power.
- Sufficient power outlets needed in scoring and hospitality rooms.

## Scoreboard

- Technician on site for set up to assist with scoreboard connections with our IT team.
- Preferred the venue has a scaler for output to laptop. If not, a controller with HDMI or SKI inputs.

## Knoxington Station for Athletes

- 10' x 20' a space indoors with tables, chairs & electrical outlets. Not suitable over carpet surface.
- Access to showers in which athletes can wash their hair throughout the competition and must be available on the final day of competition.

## Expo Space

- One booth 10' x 20' for merchandise vendor with one electrical outlet, six 6' tables & two chairs.
- Room for four additional booths 10' x 10' to include one 6' table and two chairs each.

## Spectator Seating

- Spectator seating should be viewable of the competition area or deep side of the pool.
  - Collegiate: Seating for 500 spectators
  - National & Junior: Seating for 300 spectators
  - Youth & 12U: Seating for 300 spectators
  - Junior Olympic: Seating for 900 spectators
  - Masters: Seating for 150 spectators

## Parking

- Adequate parking space for all USA Artistic Swimming officials, event workers, vendors, exhibitors, participants, and spectators.
- Free parking for event staff, judges and volunteers.

## Pipe & Drape

- We need approximately 124' x 10' tall of black pipe and drape with weighted base plates.

## If the event is outdoors

- Shade structure for all event set up around the pool deck.
- Shade structure for spectators & athlete team areas.
