

Suggested guidelines for first contact with AMIGO Mentor:

- 1) Introduce yourself, your year of training, hospital.
- 2) Basic information about your background: hometown/educational background/family.
- 3) Briefly describe your career aspirations and goals in fellowship.
- 4) Identify one or two questions/ areas of guidance for your mentor to help you with.
- 5) Attach your CV and request your mentor's CV.
- 6) Invite them to set up a time for your first meeting (at ACR, over the phone, etc).
