

Located midway along the west coast of Florida, Hillsborough County has three incorporated cities – Tampa, Temple Terrace, and Plant City. Hillsborough County is the commercial and industrial heart of Tampa Bay. The fourth largest county in Florida, Hillsborough is home to about 1.5 million residents. Hillsborough County has seven County Commissioners who develop policy for the County and provide direction on programs for continued improvements of the area and for the welfare of its residents. The County's departments work to foster community prosperity and provide a positive quality of life.

The Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners is comprised of seven members elected from seven districts. **Districts 1-4** are geographic (shown in the map above). Voters within those boundaries elect an individual commissioner to represent their district. **Districts 5-7** are countywide. All voters within the County elect three commissioners to represent the three countywide districts.

About the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners

There are seven members on the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners. Four are elected from single-member districts, and three are elected at-large (countywide). The Board approves the County's operating and capital budgets and the County's Capital Improvement Program. The Board may take action on programs for the improvement of the County and the welfare of its residents.

Under a Charter Ordinance that went into effect in May 1985, County Commissioners are directed to perform legislative functions of government by developing policy for the management of Hillsborough County. The County Administrator, who is appointed by the Board, and administrative staff are responsible for the implementation of these policies.

Board of County Commissioners Meetings and Events

Regular Board meetings are open to the public and are generally held on the first and third Wednesdays of each month, beginning at 9 a.m., on the second floor of County Center.

The Board schedules public hearings and workshops on specific issues during the year and holds informal meetings in different areas of the county.

Administration

Hillsborough County's Administrator is an appointed official responsible for carrying out all decisions, policies, ordinances, and motions made by the Board of County Commissioners. The Administrator oversees all County administrative departments, and prepares an annual operating and capital budget.

County Attorney

The County Attorney is appointed by the Board of County Commissioners to advise and represent the Board, the County Administrator, and County departments. The office also prosecutes and defends legal actions by and against the County as approved or directed by the Board.

County Internal Auditor

The Office of the County Internal Auditor was approved by the voters as part of the Hillsborough County Charter revision in 2002. The Auditor is appointed by and reports to the Board of County Commissioners. The Auditor advises and assists the Board by conducting studies of the operation of County programs and services.

History of Hillsborough County

Hillsborough County takes its name from Wills Hill, British Secretary of State to the Colonies from 1768-1772. It was first mapped and explored by the Spanish in the early 16th century. Between 1559 and 1819, the area now called Florida was under the rule of four nations: Spain, France, Great Britain, and the United States. The United States purchased Florida from Spain in 1821 for \$5 million.

On January 25, 1834, the U.S. Legislative Council for the Territory of Florida approved an act organizing Hillsborough as Florida's 19th county. In 1845, Florida was granted statehood.

At that time, Hillsborough County was a sprawling area that included what is now Pinellas, Polk, Manatee, Sarasota, Charlotte, DeSoto, Hardee, and Highlands counties, most of Glades County, and part of Lee County. Despite its size, Hillsborough's population was only 836, not including soldiers or Native Americans.

When the first Commissioners met in 1846, the topics were taxes, transportation, a new courthouse and jail, and downtown development. The County tax raised \$148.69 that year. Commissioners were paid \$2 a day while in session.

In 1846, Commissioners approved plans for a new courthouse after the original building, a small log cabin, was burned during the Second Seminole War. The project was turned over to Capt. James McKay in 1847, and he completed a two-story house, 20 feet by 45 feet, at a cost of \$1,358. Commissioners later paid McKay an extra \$10 for additional work.

In 1851, a red brick courthouse with a silver dome was built, occupying one square block in downtown Tampa. Torn down in 1952, this distinctive courthouse is represented in the County logo. The current courthouse was built in 1952, and a new County government administration building, called County Center, opened in 1994. It was renamed Frederick B. Karl County Center in 2000, in honor of the County Administrator who was instrumental in the purchase of the building.

Aging Services coordinates essential health and wellness services for Hillsborough County residents age 50 and older to encourage maximum independence and prosperity. Aging Services emphasizes the seven dimensions of wellness: physical, emotional, intellectual, social, spiritual, environmental, and financial. The department offers intake and screening assessments, individualized information and referral services, case management, senior centers and adult day care, nutrition services, transportation, in-home services, and a centralized customer care line.

Senior centers serve as a gateway to the County's aging network, connecting active adults to vital community services that can help them stay healthy and independent. Services include health, fitness, and wellness programs, education and arts programs, nutrition services, public benefits counseling, transportation, recreational activities, special events, and volunteer and civic engagement opportunities.

Nutrition Centers

Hillsborough County offers nutrition centers to promote the general health and well-being of older adults. Services are intended to reduce hunger and food insecurity, promote socialization, and delay the onset of adverse health conditions. Offerings include Silver Platter Social Dining for nutritious lunchtime meals, nutrition education and counseling, wellness programs, transportation, and recreational activities. Home delivered meals are provided to older and disabled adults who are homebound and unable to prepare meals.

Case Management/In-Home Services

Case managers conduct comprehensive assessments to determine appropriate services to optimize a senior's ability to remain at home and prevent or delay the need for long-term care placement. They coordinate necessary services and provide ongoing monitoring of service provision and the client's needs.

Service providers may include a combination of county, for-profit, nonprofit, and faith-based organizations. For eligible clients, services may include personal care, respite care for caregivers, companionship, housekeeping, shopping, emergency alert system, and pest management.

Children's Services offers programs and services designed to empower and protect children, teens, and families on all levels.

Children in Need of Services/Families in Need of Services (CINS/FINS)

Provides youth in Hillsborough County ages 6-17 and their families with residential and community counseling services focused on anger management, problem resolution, family conflict, and coping skills to help reduce juvenile crime and strengthen family bonds.

Case Staffing

Case Staffing is held by a committee and will develop a plan for services, which may include recommending the filing of a CINS petition with the court. The committee may also recommend additional services or referrals to other agencies.

Residential Program

Short-term residential respite program which offers youth ages 10 -17 residential services and counseling. Youth receive:

- Food, clothing, and a safe, comfortable place to sleep
- A positive, productive, and healthy living environment
- Individual, group and family counseling
- On-campus school access or transport
- Youth development programs, supervised recreation, live management, and social skills counseling
- Linkages to community services for aftercare

Community Counseling Program

Trained counselors provide individual and family therapy to youth ages 6-17 at sites throughout Hillsborough County with flexible daytime and evening hours.

Safe Place

Licensed agency to provide access to immediate help and supportive resources for youth in need. Many of the nearly 200 Safe Place locations throughout the County are open 24/7 for those needing a place to go, no questions asked.

Code Enforcement is responsible for the compliance and enforcement of numerous codes and ordinances, including the property-maintenance and land-management codes, to preserve the quality and value of public and private property by eliminating conditions that threaten the life, health, safety, and general welfare of residents. Through the effective application of code enforcement practices, investigators oversee property preservation and maintenance, foreclosed property registration, and land use compatibility with zoning regulations.

Residents can report possible code violations in unincorporated Hillsborough County, including property that is unmaintained or is in disrepair, by contacting Code Enforcement by phone at (813) 274-6604 or through the online Customer Service Center at HCFL.gov/AtYourService. Inspections generally are performed within three business days.

Animal Control

A division of Code Enforcement, Animal Control ensures adherence with local and state laws that protect pets and people. Partnering with local law enforcement, public safety duties include:

- Transport of sick, injured and stray pets
- Investigation and reporting of animal bites and dangerous dogs
- Response and investigation of animal neglect/cruelty report
- Issuance of citations and court case presentations

Conservation & Environmental Lands Management oversees more than 84,000 acres of conservation parks and environmental lands protecting some of the County's most valuable assets - including river floodplains, mangrove swamps, relict scrub communities, and vast areas of longleaf pine sandhills and flatwoods - while providing residents and visitors with opportunities for beach access, wildlife viewing, canoeing/kayaking, fishing, hiking, biking, and horseback riding. The department is also responsible for the management and operations of the Upper Tampa Bay Trail, Bakas Equestrian Center, and all County-owned boat ramps.

Environmental Lands Management division administers the Jan K. Platt Environmental Lands Acquisition and Protection Program (ELAPP) to acquire and manage environmentally sensitive lands. The Environmental Services Division maintains regulatory compliance for environmentally permitted, County-owned infrastructure; handles compliance and monitoring for drinking water, groundwater, wastewater, groundwater recharge, solid waste, closed landfills, and stormwater quality; maintains permitting for wastewater, groundwater recharge, and stormwater quality; provides quality assurance and quality control for the environmental laboratory; provides oversight for phosphate mining and subsequent land reclamation and aquifer recharge projects; reviews development projects for stormwater quality concerns; manages the Industrial Pretreatment Program; operates a certified environmental laboratory; manages innovation and resiliency objectives for County operations as well as the Local Mitigation Strategy; and provides environmental community outreach programs for preventing wastewater system blockages from commercial and residential fats, oils, grease, wipes, and other unflushables, stormwater protection, and water conservation. The County uses the Cross-Connection Control program, mandated by the Safe Drinking Water Act, it prevents potable water contamination by eliminating unprotected connections to potential contaminants. This is ensured through the installation and annual testing of backflow prevention devices.

When used cooking oil is disposed of down the sink it can cause clogs that are costly to the homeowner and the County.

These clogs can also contribute to sanitary sewer overflows that are harmful to the public and the environment. Residents are asked to place the oil in glass or plastic containers with a lid prior to placing in the cabinets, as these containers are recycled. The collected used cooking oil is recycled by a third-party vendor into products such as animal feed supplements and on and off-road diesel and jet fuel.

Serves as a bridge, allowing low-income households to avoid utility service interruption so they do not have to make difficult choices between paying their utility bill(s) or other necessities such as food and prescriptions drugs.

Community Services Block Grant

Offers a wide-wage range of community-based activities to reduce poverty. The block grant requires activities to be focused on reduction of poverty; revitalization of low-income communities; removing obstacles that block achievement of self-sufficiency; and empowerment of low-income families to increase participation in the affairs of their community.

Solid Waste Management

Solid Waste Management is responsible for the handling of more than 1 million tons of solid waste (garbage, recyclables, and yard waste) generated in the county every year. The integrated system includes the Resource Recovery Facility, Southeast County Landfill, Transfer Stations, Community Collection

Centers, recycling services, donation program, Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events, a biosolids composting facility, and the Yard and Wood Waste Processing Facilities.

Customers receive two collections of garbage, one collection of recyclables and one collection of yard waste each week. Recyclables should be loose in the cart, not in a bag, clean, empty, and dry. Accepted recyclables include paper, cardboard, paperboard such as cereal and shoe boxes, plastic bottles and containers, metal and tin cans, glass jars and bottles, and milk and juice cartons. Collection hours are 6 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

There is no garbage, recycling or yard waste collection on Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Memorial Day, Juneteenth, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. There is no garbage collection on New Year's Day, only regular recycling and yard waste collection. A service charge for collection and disposal is regulated by the Board of County Commissioners and is paid yearly as a non-ad valorem assessment on the property tax bill.

Community Collection Centers

Residents may dispose of items here that are not collectible at the curb. All Community Collection Centers (CCCs) are open Monday through Saturday, 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and accept collectible waste (household garbage for exempt customers only) and non-collectible waste (furniture, appliances, scrap metal, tires, rechargeable and lead acid batteries, and more). Hillsborough County residential customers who are billed the annual solid waste collection and disposal assessment or receive an exemption from curbside pickup must show a copy of their tax bill and photo ID for free disposal of these materials. Household paint and electronics are accepted for free disposal at the CCCs by all Hillsborough County residents by showing a valid photo ID only.

Door-to-Door Transportation
