- Alcohol and/or intoxicated people are prohibited.
- Running, bicycles, skates, scooters and similar devices are not permitted in the park.

About the park

The Eureka Springs Conservation Park was established in 1938 by botanist and traveler Albert Greenberg as a botanical garden. In 1967, Greenberg donated the gardens to Hillsborough County, making Eureka Springs Conservation Park the only botanical garden in the park system. Lovers of horticulture will savor the 31-acre natural beauty, especially the park's rose garden and greenhouse. Visitors can stroll along the boardwalk and walking trails that wind through a lush floodplain forest of maples and cypresses. The park also features picnic tables, an enclosed rental pavilion, and a picturesque pergola ideal for weddings.
