

**HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY, FLORIDA COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR ORDER  
EXTENDING (EXTENSION TWO) THE STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY  
DECLARED ON APRIL 25, 2025, BANNING OUTDOOR BURNING IN  
RESPONSE TO COUNTYWIDE DROUGHT CONDITIONS**

**WHEREAS**, the State of Florida and Hillsborough County are experiencing drought-like conditions and higher than normal temperatures; and

**WHEREAS**, the Keetch-Byram Drought Index, a soil moisture measurement in which a measurement of 400 denotes a significant danger of fire, and Hillsborough County currently measured at 609 and has remained above 500 for the month of April, with drought conditions expected to remain high to very high for the month of May; and

**WHEREAS**, the Florida Forest Service Readiness Level for Hillsborough County is at level 3 (High) on a scale of 1 to 5, with 5 being the most dangerous level; and

**WHEREAS**, the environmental and weather conditions in the State of Florida and Hillsborough County present a heightened danger from fire; and

**WHEREAS**, since the beginning of January, 1,761 forest and brush fires throughout the State have burned over 74,891 acres, with several fires continuing to burn; and

**WHEREAS**, Hillsborough County must take timely emergency measures because of the potential for injury or damage to life and property within the county, from the heightened threat of fire; and

**WHEREAS**, Hillsborough County Fire Rescue has indicated that in light of the drought conditions existing in Hillsborough County, the act of outdoor burning poses a risk to the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the county; and

**WHEREAS**, the fertile conditions for forest and brush fires create an emergency condition that necessitates the immediate enactment of a local state of emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, other measures may have to be taken in order to mitigate the potential for causing further threatening conditions and/or extensive damage to public utilities, public buildings, public communications, public streets and roads, public drainage systems, as well as privately owned property; and

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and Hillsborough County Ordinance 06-13 (Hillsborough County Code of Laws and Ordinances, Part A, Chapter 22, Article II, Sections 22-19 through 22-30), authorizes Hillsborough County to declare a state of local emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 22, Article II, Section 22-21, Hillsborough County Code of Ordinances and Laws, empowers the Board, Board Chair, or County Administrator, as designee, to declare that a local state of emergency exists; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 2, 2025, the County Administrator issued an Order extending the state of local emergency declared on April 25, 2025, in response to countywide drought conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, a state of emergency declared under the authority of Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and the Hillsborough County Emergency Management Ordinance, shall have a duration of no more than seven days, renewable for further periods of no more than seven days; and

**WHEREAS**, in light of ongoing dry weather conditions, it is prudent to continue to have a local emergency declaration in place prohibiting open burning in Hillsborough County.

**NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR OF HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY, FLORIDA, ON THIS 9th DAY OF MAY 2025, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY DESIGNATED IN SECTION 252.38 F.S., AND SECTION 22-22 OF THE HILLSBOUGH COUNTY CODE ISSUES THIS ORDER RESOLVING THAT:**

1. The said ongoing drought and heightened fire hazard conditions pose a serious threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the people and property of Hillsborough County, Florida, and that a state of local emergency is hereby, declared, effective immediately for the incorporated and unincorporated areas of Hillsborough County.
2. The County Administrator, in consultation with the Fire Chief, and the Director of Emergency Management, is authorized to take whatever action is deemed necessary and appropriate to protect, inform, and educate the public from the threat of wildfires.
3. Except for burning specifically authorized by the Florida Forest Service (FFS), all outdoor burning is hereby prohibited. The unpermitted outside igniting of flammable or combustible material, including fireworks and sparklers, is prohibited. Outside grilling is permissible only if a barbecue grill is used and is constantly attended. Any authorized outdoor burning approved by FFS shall be conducted in strict compliance with the state statutes, agency rules, or any other written conditions. Any person conducting outdoor burning authorized by FFS must contact the Emergency Dispatch Center (EDC) by phone no later than 8 a.m. on the day of the burn, to notify them of the authorization.
4. The County Administrator, in consultation with the Fire Chief and the Director of Emergency Management, is authorized to direct evacuations of any areas imminently threatened by wildfires.
5. This Executive Order supersedes and controls over any County ordinance, rule, or policy that may be in conflict with this Order.
6. This Executive Order takes effect immediately and shall remain in effect for seven days unless extended or rescinded by the Board, Board Chair or County Administrator.

7. As provided by Section 252.50, Florida Statutes, any person who violates this order is guilty of a second-degree misdemeanor, punishable in accordance with Sections 775.082 and 775.083, Florida Statutes.
